Character Education

Character education underpins the rigorous academic programme and quest of our school to nurture and develop the individual child.

Our aim is that our pupils live truly fulfilled and happy lives. We offer a service to parents so that their children become young men and women of virtue and integrity.

Our Character Development Programme is based on the virtues of Faith, Hope and Love and on the four traditional pillars of Christian character:

Justice Respecting the rights and needs of others

Fortitude Personal resilience and adaptability

Prudence Sound judgement

Self-Control Temperance

Catholic Ethos



The school stresses and supports the primary role of parents in their children's overall education and spiritual development.

A central part of our service to parents is to teach our pupils how to recognise the truth, goodness and beauty of the Catholic faith in everything they learn and to put their faith into practice in everything they do.

The school Oratory is at the centre of the sacramental life of the school. It is a quiet place where children and parents alike can reflect and pray.

A Catholic priest from the Prelature of Opus Dei comes regularly to the school to provide children with the opportunity to attend Mass and the Sacrament of Reconciliation. He also provides talks and other means of spiritual formation for staff and parents.



Individual Development

THE TUTORIAL SYSTEM BRINGS A HEALTHY AND PRACTICAL FOCUS TO THE ACADEMIC AND PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT OF EACH CHILD

Oakwood School has a continuous Character Development Programme which starts in the Nursery and Lower School, fostering the development and study of virtues such as sincerity, industriousness, order, cheerfulness, generosity and service to others.

The Tutorial System is a natural fruit of the philosophy underlying our school, that parents are the first educators of their children. The tutor takes a direct and personal interest in each child's personal character development and regularly shares this with parents. There is also a more formal termly programme of parent and teacher meetings which allow for a thorough discussion of the progress of each child.

A Complete Education

MUSIC & THE ARTS

Music plays a vital role in the curriculum at every level. Children have the opportunity to learn the Recorder and Ukulele and are given specialist singing lessons. The majority of pupils in the Upper School receive individual music tuition. Piano, Flute, Guitar and Violin are the most popular instruments. There are many opportunities to perform throughout the year.

DRAMA

The school stages a wide variety of school productions which provide opportunities for all children to become involved throughout the year.

SPORT

Sport is one of the most effective ways in which the school's ideals are realised. We have our own dedicated sports coach and indoor and outdoor sports and play facilities.

EXTRA CURRICULAR

We offer a wide range of extra curricular activities and clubs which take place at lunchtime or after school. These include Art, Ballet, Chess, Football and Speech & Drama.



The Nursery School



OAKWOOD NURSERY HAS ITS OWN DEDICATED FACILITIES INCLUDING A SEPARATE AND SECURE OUTDOOR PLAY AREA AND ACCESS TO SCHOOL FACILITIES SUCH AS THE HALL, MUSIC ROOM, LIBRARY AND ART ROOM

Each child has a remarkable capacity for acquiring knowledge and skills in these years that have rightly been called the golden age of learning. The right kind of nursery education can make a huge difference to a child's ultimate academic success and to the development of all the facets of their personality. The Early Years Programme has been designed to meet these challenges and to build on success.

The atmosphere and structure of the day are carefully tailored so that a great deal of learning is achieved in a caring and happy environment. The results are that children are well-prepared and move up the school, happy and confident. Good parent-teacher communication is crucial at this stage in a child's education and the effectiveness and joy of early learning is enhanced when it is encouraged and continued in the home.

RECEPTION TO YEAR 2

A THOROUGH GROUNDING IN THE FUNDAMENTAL BUILDING BLOCKS OF EDUCATION

The Lower School is situated on the ground floor and is a bright and welcoming environment in which a high standard of work and behaviour is achieved. The classrooms are well equipped with a wide variety of teaching resources. The children have access to a play area as well as to the school's hall and other facilities. In their first years at school each child acquires the necessary skills in

numeracy and literacy upon which a first-class education is based. A class teacher takes all core curriculum subjects with specialist teachers taking Music, Singing, Spanish and Games. English and Maths have a central place in the timetable but children also study Art, Character Development, Drama, Geography, History, Religious Studies and Science.

We encourage an investigative approach and a keen awareness of the natural world. The children go on many excursions and benefit from outside speakers and visitors. Information Technology is used extensively. As children progress through the Lower School, work becomes more formal and ability groups within the classes allow the teachers to stream pupils for English and Maths.

All children are stretched and supported in order to reach their own personal potential. By the end of Lower School the children will have received a thorough educational grounding and be well prepared to meet the challenges of the Upper School.



The Upper School



YEAR 3 TO YEAR 6

DESIGNED TO FOSTER A LOVE OF LEARNING, SOUND STUDY SKILLS AND THE ABILITY TO THINK, LEARN AND WORK INDEPENDENTLY

Children in Year 3 and 4 have a Form Tutor who takes most of the core subjects. Children in Year 5 and 6 are mainly taught by subject specialist teachers.

The children have a full and varied curriculum covering the traditional academic subjects as well as Art, Music, Classics and Computing. We ensure that children are introduced to a wide range of literature and use the library to foster a love of reading.

Informal assessments take place throughout the year and formal assessments take place at the start and end of the year. The academic work inevitably becomes more demanding as children progress towards the final preparations for scholarship and entrance examinations to their secondary schools. Our commitment, following discussion with each parent and child, is to prepare all of our children for a successful transition to the school that is right for them.

OAKWOOD SCHOOL IS ONE OF FOUR SCHOOLS FOUNDED BY PACT EDUCATIONAL TRUST. ALL FOUR SCHOOLS ARE UNDERPINNED BY A CATHOLIC ETHOS AND A UNIQUE CHARACTER DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME THAT PERMEATES ALL ASPECTS OF SCHOOL LIFE

PACT Educational Trust was founded in 1993 by a group of Catholic parents and educators to establish schools and other means of supporting families whose deepest desire is that their children grow into men and women of integrity committed to living their whole lives by Christian principles; men and women who, among the exhilarating, and challenging opportunities that the future presents, are resolved to be the exemplary citizens and inspirational leaders that our society needs.

The Trustees and founders believe that parents should be at the heart of the education of their children and that it is the role of schools to be of service to the family in trying to achieve this goal.

PACT has, to date, founded four independent schools. In 1996 it set up Oakwood School in Purley, Surrey and in 2004 Oliver House School in Clapham, South London. In September 2013 PACT launched two secondary schools, The Cedars for boys and The Laurels for girls, in Croydon and Clapham respectively.

PACT is governed by a Board of Trustees, all of whom give their services without any financial reward.

The PACT Board is the governing body of Oakwood, Oliver House, The Cedars and The Laurels. They meet regularly to discuss all aspects of school life, and the meetings are also attended by the CEO of the charity and the Headteachers of each school.



Charter of Educational Principles

1 PACT recognises that since parents are the first and the most important educators of their children, they have the right to choose the type of education they want for their own children, in accordance with their philosophical, cultural, moral and religious convictions (ref. Article 26 of the United Nations Universal Declaration of Human Rights).

2 PACT exists to encourage, integrate and coordinate the involvement of parents, teachers and pupils in the setting up and development of schools which aim to provide each pupil with a full and balanced education in intellectual, cultural and spiritual matters.

3 The main objective of each PACT school is the all-round education of its pupils. A personalised Tutorial System will ensure that each pupil develops his or her talents to the full and acquires a sense of individual and social responsibility.

4 Academic education should aim at excellence across the whole range of intellectual disciplines. The acquisition of knowledge and the ability to reason should be fostered in formal class teaching as well as in small groups and through individual attention. Science and arts subjects should not be seen as independent from each other, but should be presented as parts of a whole, structured according to real life. Each educational discipline should stimulate pupils to discover not just individual truths, but also the greater truth which exists in all things.

5 Character formation should be based on the exercise of freedom with the consequent responsibilities and should have the following main objectives:

- to encourage the fullest development of virtues such as sincerity, hard work, perseverance, self-discipline, fortitude, temperance and cheerfulness
- to develop emotional responsibility in order to establish mature relationships
- to demonstrate, through the example of those in authority, that the exercise of power carries with it obligations of service and, therefore, deserves cooperation and respect
- to teach that work well done is a principal means of personal and social improvement.

6 Spiritual training should not seek to impose doctrine, but should always respect sincerely held beliefs; it should therefore be able to be shared by all those who, irrespective of creed, recognise the spiritual dimension of man. For Christians, spiritual training should have the following main objectives:

- to develop a profound sense of one's condition as a child of God
- to be conscious that all Christians have received a personal call to sanctity and to enable them to realise the fullness of their faith in their own lives and every-day work
- to teach that charity is the most important Christian virtue and that it is in our dealings with others that opportunities arise to provide human, professional and apostolic service. Religious training should correspond faithfully to that of the Catholic Church.

7 PACT schools should seek to share their resources with the greatest number of people. Each PACT school should become a social and educational centre for the community which it serves, through Family Enrichment Programmes and other social and civic initiatives.

8 The participation of parents, teachers and pupils in PACT schools should lead them:

- to share the educational objectives of the school and to take on associated responsibilities
- to accept, respect and defend other people's freedom
- to uphold family values and the integrity of marriage

9 In PACT schools, there should be no discrimination on social, cultural or financial grounds. On the contrary, any differences should be seen as a means of mutual enrichment.

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
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
